450 ha extensive wood pasture "dehesa" grazed by native cattles and Iberian pigs. It is an organically farmed operation which also performs direct marketing of meat and agrotourism. The Life project here involves key lines water management, pasture improvement, planting of fodder banks, composting, biochar and restoration of traditional buildings for pig raising.

1800 ha extensive wood pasture grazed by several cattle breeds including *wagyu* (a japanesse breed). The farm is an example of international marketing of high quality meat improved with dehesa forage resources, and it is certified as McDonald's flagship farm (https://www.flagshipfarmers.com).
